Having used Woot Math, what are your feelings about it?

I definitely think the visuals helped with understanding, and made the students more deeply involved in the program. I also liked that I had more than one student who said to me after using Woot Math that, "I understand equivalence better."

Having used Woot Math, what are your students feelings about it?

I feel like they are more confident in their ability with fractions - both comparing fractions and understanding equivalent fractions.

How helpful do you think it was for your students?

I think it was really helpful due to the repetitive nature. They used it 4 to 5 times per week which I think was really helpful.

Did you notice any changes in your students attitudes about the material or their self confidence during the program?

I feel like Woot Math did have an impact. One of my students that has been struggling all year, was able to explain equivalence to me, which was huge. Even though they used it at the end of the year when they're really ready for summer, they were still excited to have Woot Math at the stations. When we stopped the program, they were kind of bummed. That shows me a lot in terms of effectiveness, and I'm definitely planning to use it next year.

How engaged were they by Woot Math?

They were pretty engaged - especially given it was the end of the year. On a scale of 1 to 10 I would say 8 or 9. They were really always excited to use Woot Math.

What aspects did your students like best?

I definitely think they like doing it every day. At the end of the year there are changes to the routine, but they liked that every day at 9:15 they did Woot Math - they wanted it and looked forward to it.

What aspects did your students like least?

Some of my kiddos thought they had finished a lesson, and were frustrated if they had to redo it the next day at the timed stations.

What aspects did you like best?

I really like that it was adaptive to each student. I have such a wide variety of students, but they could all do it - not only could they do it, but they could all be successful.
