Teacher #4 (3rd, 4th, 5th Grade)

Having used Woot Math, what are your feelings about it?

Using it with my students, it was clear that it is very engaging. All of my students really liked it and wanted to do it. (Sometimes my third grade wasn't sure what the question was asking, which I didn't get so much from my 4th or 5th grade.)

I wish I could have done it earlier in the year. At the end of the year, the students have so much scheduled and they're more distracted.

I loved the interactive part of it.

Having used Woot Math, what are your students feelings about it?

They really liked it - even after doing it every day, five days a week!

If I used it earlier in the year, I would limit it to more 3-4 times per week, but we had to use it more for the pilot.

I actually thought they would tire of it, but they seemed to always enjoy it.

How helpful do you think it was for your students?

It was very helpful. I really liked that it was so hands-on and they could manipulate the pieces.

I didn't get to the teacher tools.

Did you notice any changes in your students attitudes about the material or their self confidence during the program?

I couldn't speak definitely to that but thought that it was good that they were so engaged. I really liked that it is self paced. There was no blame happening between them and other kids.

And they were really excited to move up a level. I liked that the level was appropriate to them and success was accessible. That isn't often the case in the classroom.

How engaged were they by Woot Math?

Very engaged 95-100% of the time. Never said they didn't want to do it.

What aspects did your students like best?

Being able to manipulate pieces and the immediate feedback. If they didn't get it, they could try again.

What aspects did your students like least?

3rd - Not being able to understand the question 4th and 5th - nothing comes to mind - always enjoyed it

What aspects did you like best?

I could also interact and see what they were doing.
